1. In accordance with AFR 900-3, 5 November 1959, the following emblem is approved for the 2860th GEEIA Squadron:

DESCRIPTION: On a representation of the Western hemisphere, water areas Air Force blue, land areas light green, a winged gauntleted hand fesswise, Air Force golden yellow, grasping a telephone pole, radio tower, and radar tower, silver gray, the radar antenna atop the tower and four (4) lightning flashes issuing saltirewise from the radio tower, Air Force golden yellow; outlines and details Air Force blue throughout.

SIGNIFICANCE: The emblem is symbolic of the squadron and its mission. Against a globe (to indicate this unit's worldwide mission), a winged, gauntleted hand (to represent the speed and mobility of the work force) grasps a telephone pole, a radar antenna and a radio tower to symbolize the three primary fields of our work. The emblem bears the Air Force colors, ultramarine blue and golden yellow.

2. Attached is the official painting of the emblem described above, to be forwarded to the unit for file and guidance in reproduction.

3. Unit designations are not placed on the scrolls on official emblem paintings because designations are subject to change. Each unit may place its own designation on the scroll on all reproductions of its emblem.
